Laws of Life Helps Teachers Build Relationships

The Georgia Laws of Life Essay Contest has become a key lesson for English Language Arts classes, fostering meaningful connections and understanding among students and their teachers at many participating high schools. Amanda Howell of Rome High School shared her initial perception of the essay contest, admitting that she initially viewed it as just another assignment for grading. However, upon reading the first essays, she was amazed by the depth and uniqueness they brought.

"Our relationships with our students have become so much richer and our ability to connect with those 180 students has been made so much better" Howell states. Reflecting and writing the essay has led to life-changing perspectives, from student stories of resilience in overcoming challenges in foster care to discovering purpose through simple moments with family. At Rome High School, the contest is integrated into the curriculum, with a focus on personal identity and narrative exploration. Howell explained that the ELA team collaborated to make the contest a schoolwide initiative, adapting and maturing the lesson as students progress through different grade levels. At the **2022 GLL Founders Celebration**, Amanda shared her gratitude for the contest and support from the **Rome Seven Hills Rotary Club** who makes the Laws of Life Student Recognition program a memorable event each year.

In celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the contest, GLL looked to honor the teachers who have shaped young minds and fostered a passion for learning. The Honor Roll Society was established to allow individuals to express appreciation for the influential educators in their lives. Georgia Rotary Clubs along with friends of the contest were invited to make a tax-deductible contribution of \$25 or more to GLL to nominate a deserving teacher. RYLA Update

It's Time to Think About RYLA 2024



It's a new year and that means it's time to start thinking about RYLA!! Not that we ever really stop thinking about RYLA... If you've never heard of RYLA, here's a quick introduction:

• Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is an intensive training program that targets young adults, ages 15-18, to further develop character and leadership skills and learn about Rotary. RYLA in

District 6900 is a 5-day summer camp experience.

- Participants are nominated by local Rotary clubs, which are responsible for all expenses. For these young adults, this recognition offers the opportunity to build self-confidence, gain exposure to a variety of issues and people, meet active community leaders, and learn valuable information and career skills.
- RYLA gives Rotarians the opportunity to mentor promising young leaders serving their own communities and beyond. Rotarians serve as resources for participants on the path to becoming professional and community leaders. In turn, RYLA can bring new energy to a Rotary district, inspire ideas for service, increase support of community service projects, and develop future Rotarians.
- RYLA 2024 will be held June 8-12 on the campus of Georgia Southwestern State University. Cost per student is \$475, and this covers all necessary expenses related to attending RYLA. For any students riding our charter buses from the Atlanta area, there is an additional \$50/per student cost.
- If you are a club President, President-Elect, RYLA Chair, Service Chair, or Assistant Governor you should have received an email a few weeks ago containing all details about the 2024 edition of RYLA. Attached to the email were all relevant forms and documents. If you didn't receive this email or can't locate it, please reach out to District Chairs Susan Ruckman and Jaclyn Donovan.

We hope that you and your club will consider sponsoring a student (or more than one) to attend RYLA this year! We have seen first-hand how it can change the lives of our students and want to share that experience with as many students as possible. "The GRSP Foundation is grateful to Teri for her support and commitment to our program," Drake said. "It is fitting that we would honor a Thomasville Rotarian as our first recipient of the Frank Bentley, Sr., Fellow. Our program was founded by Thomasville Rotarian William A. "Will" Watt, Sr., in 1946, and we recognize donors on the \$1,000 level as Will Watt Fellows. Teri earned that distinction many years ago and sets an excellent example of service and generosity for others to follow."

In addition in drafting students for the next class, leadership, Trustees and staff discussed ways to enhance our 78-year program of serving international college students with one year ambassadorial scholarships. GRSP's summer trustee meeting is scheduled for July 13. Conclave is scheduled to be hosted by District 6900 and will be held in Columbus August 23-25.


There are other hotels on the island, as well as short-term rentals and camping opportunities, but as of right now only the hotels listed here are offering reduced rates for conference attendees.

Challenge Accepted, DG Andre!



At the beginning of the new Rotary year, the **Rotary Club of Peachtree Cit**y was given what seemed to be an unattainable goal for Foundation Giving for this year. Due to our record-setting year in 2022-2023 of \$97,000, our goal for this year was set at \$100,000 to be eligible for any district citations for the year. President Amy and Foundation Chair Will knew this would be one of the biggest challenges for the year

and would need 100% participation from our club and our community to reach this goal.

As with most things in Peachtree City, though, we did not shy away and simply put our heads together to come up with some creative ways to reach the new goal.

- Contact each member within range of the 'next' level of Paul Harris Fellow and encourage them to donate accordingly: Mission Accomplished – five members became major donors in the FIRST meeting of the new year and over 15 more have reached the next level of PHF.
- 2. Come up with a quick and easy way to have fun while raising money each week for the Foundatio: Mission Accomplished – Foundation Football was kicked off for a third year with more members participating than ever before. At \$1 pledged per point scored across our pee-wee league, local high schools, NCAA and NFL teams, we raised over \$14,000 in three months!
- 3. Host a Foundation FUNdraiser to include our community partners: Mission Accomplished through the efforts of a few key members on the committee, the first annual Bourbon & Bow Ties / Pinot & Pearls event was created. With ~200 community attendees, live music, great food and most importantly – awesome bourbon & wine – we were able to bring in over \$30,000 in a matter of three hours!

We are proud to say that we have reached 110%+ of our goal for the year (over \$110,000 in Foundation giving) already by January 1 through these efforts and the commitment of our entire membership and the extended community! We can't wait to see what can be accomplished in our district with these funds being returned to us over the next 3 years!

Celebrating Shared Success in Brazil

Alpharetta Rotary is proud to announce the 'grand opening' celebration on Saturday, April 13th of the APADPEL Down Syndrome Training and Education Center in Pelotas, R.S. Brazil.

14 Rotary clubs and 3 Interact clubs spanning three districts and two countries have partnered with universities, companies, local governments and the state of Rio Grande do Sul to construct a 6,600 sq. ft. facility to house occupational therapy and education for APADPEL –The Association of Parents of People with Down Syndrome of Pelotas. Training and education will be underwritten through a \$70,000 Global Grant approved by Rotary International in 2022.

Chief shared how the transition from a primarily volunteer team to full-time, fully trained Department has gone through 2023. 2024 is looking more positive with some new recruits as well as better compensation for all involved. In his closing, he also invited attendees to their Fire Citizen Academy starting in February.

District 6900 offered a Special District Grant to address mental health needs of our aging population. "Aloha to Aging, Inc." established in 2009, provides music and art therapy, day respite, caregiver support, and educational programming for those facing dementia, Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, and general aging issues. The District Grant money is being used to purchase supplies and equipment so that "Aloha to Aging, Inc." can continue this important work.

"A Day in the Life" simulation is a 1 ½ hour immersive program that offers participants a glimpse into the world of the aging, and practical responses to improve the life of the loved one. Ten sessions are scheduled to offer this especially to Rotarians, but this programming is ongoing to the broad community. 
