HIGH SCHOOL PREP FOOTBALL CRANKS UP

Each of our Region 4-AAAA high schools - Griffin, Pike, Spalding – are completing their preseason training and scrimmages this week. All three schools kick off their regular seasons on the road next week. Jarrett Laws, Griffin High's new head coach, said that being at Griffin High is a dream. "We have 8 returning starters on offense, and 6 returning starters on defense from a team that went 15-0 and won the state 4A championship last year," he said. Laws and his staff are stressing to his players that "character counts". He has initiated a program he calls "Win the Week" where the players and the team have a checklist to complete on and off the field each week that culminates in Friday Night Under the Lights. Brad Weber, the Pike County Pirate head coach, noted that the Pirates have come a long way over the past few years. The school has rapidly grown from competing in 2A high school sports to this season when they join the 4A ranks and will take the field against schools like Upson-Lee, Locust Grove, Griffin, Jonesboro, and Spalding. "We are excited about the challenge," he said. "We are looking forward to playing these teams on our schedule." Coach Weber agreed with Griffin High's Laws in the importance of building character among his players. "Our biggest challenge is to mold these young guys into men," he added. Nick Davis is starting his fourth year as the Jags head coach and says that he is very excited about the upcoming season. "We have a very young football team this year," he said. "We will be starting 10 sophomores in our preseason scrimmage." He admitted that his team must stay healthy and avoid injuries in order to be competitive this year. Like Griffin and Pike, the Jags are also heavily involved in character education. Davis has brought in speakers to emphasize to his players that high school football is but a brief part of their lives and that they must prepare themselves with a great education. All three coaches agreed that Griffin and Jonesboro will be the teams to beat in their Region this year.
